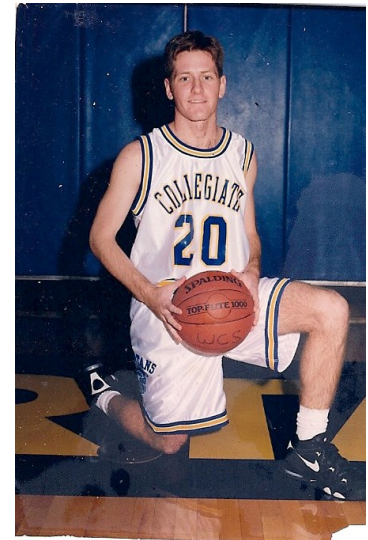

Program: Ed O'Malley



With \$30 million in his pocket and instructions to spend the money how he thought it would be best distributed, Ed O'Malley is responsible for a unique organization, the Kansas Leadership Center.

"There's nothing quite like this anywhere in the nation," Ed said of the program created by the Kansas Health Foundation.

Ed said they're guided by the thought: Of all the things we could do, what should we do?

Ed's task is to identify civic leaders throughout Kansas then train and empower them to make positive changes in their community.

"We have people who are tremendously passionate that don't have the leadership confidence and

ability to mobilize people," Ed said.

Because of the funding from KHF, this is also a health-care initiative.

Ed said strong communities have strong leaders, strong communities tend to be healthier, strong communities tend to have better schools, and children from better schools tend to be healthier.

George Fahnestock Memorial Scholarship
