Movie Review: Red Riding Hood

I'd pay to hear Gary Oldman read the instructions to boil water. So I didn't hesitate to see Gary's latest film, *Red Riding Hood*, the current version of the classic fairy tale.

Gary plays a religious werewolf hunter, Father Solomon, who visits a quaint village far from

their nearest neighbors in the kingdom. Actually, the village is more like a fortress to try to provide protection for an ongoing werewolf problem. The problem for the villagers is that Father Solomon discovers that the werewolf is one of the villagers so the fortress proves only

to keep the villagers within.
