SPEAKER: JACKIE VIETTI, BUTLER COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Butler County Community College has grown from a typical smallish Kansas institution to the 2nd largest community college in the state with an enrollment of 13,000 by following a basic plan: business and entrepreneurship.

"That the essence of Butler,' BCCC President Jackie Vietti said. "That' our long-standing hallmark."

The majority of the students are from Sedgwick County and many of the students are coming or going to Wichita State and Emporia State. There are 1200 community

colleges in the country and 19 in Kansas.

"There's an inverse relationship between the economy and community college's enrollment," said Jackie, explaining why the colleges continue to grow. While people seek jobs, they gravitate towards the training opportunities and low cost of community colleges.

Jackie said students increase their earnings by \$10,000 per year for each year of school they attend.

Butler County has six locations, the largest is in Andover, including classrooms in

one of the Andover schools where the kids can walk down the hall to begin receiving college credits.

Polly said **Joanne Rogers, Tami Bradley, and Jaden Randle** were featured in the local media.

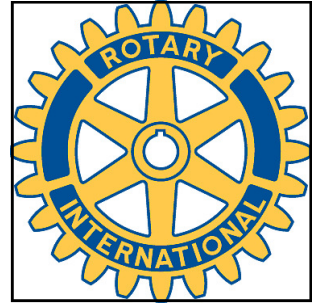
One of our guests was former member Will Momsen. **John Hurst** said he saw Will standing out-
